### LawscotTech Advisory Board Terms of Reference

The LawscotTech Advisory Board will be flexible in its composition and will need to evolve with the programme of work. The Advisory Board has discretion to invite skilled observers and advisers to provide specialist advice and guidance as it sees appropriate. It may also coopt additional solicitor representatives at its discretion where it is necessary to represent a demographic or skillset.

The Law Society Board will nominate at least one but up to three representatives from the Board to sit on the Advisory Board.

Each member of the Advisory Board will be appointed for a three-year term, renewable once. This does not apply to the Executive team.

#### Responsibilities

- a) The Advisory Board will oversee the Executive's execution of the plan to deliver LawscotTech's strategic aims.
- b) The Advisory Board will assess the value of collaboration with stakeholders, government, and other incubators to balance the resources, risk and commitments of the Society.
- c) The Advisory Board will report to the Society Board via the Executive team.
- d) The Advisory Board will identify any suitable opportunities to stimulate dialogue between the profession, those working in the legal sector, legaltech providers and key stakeholders.

Chair term:	3 years renewable once
Vice Chair:	Lay member [from the LawscotTech Community or Advisory Board]
Vice Chair term:	3 years renewable once
Chair and Vice Chair selection method:	Through the Executive team who will make a recommendation to Board.
Term for members:	3 years renewable once, except ex-officio
Selection method for members:	Application form; short listing against agreed criteria and discussion with Executive Director of Member Services and Director of Professional Practice. If more than one applicant, final decision to be made by the Society Board.
Quorum:	4 members not including the Executive team.
Frequency of meetings:	Between 5 and 10 each year, depending on business requirements.

All Advisory Board members must be willing and able to:
