Consultation on Reforms to the Packaging Waste Recycling Note (PRN) and Packaging Waste Export Recycling Note (PERN) System and Operator Approval

May 2022





### Introduction

Our Environmental Law Sub-committee welcomes the opportunity to respond to DEFRA's consultation on Consultation on Reforms to the Packaging Waste Recycling Note (PRN) and Packaging Waste Export Recycling Note (PERN) System and Operator Approval<sup>1</sup>. We do not seek to answer the consultation questions but have the following comments to put forward for consideration.

#### **General remarks**

#### Interface with Deposit Return Schemes (DRS)

We consider that the interface between the PRN/PERN system and DRS requires careful consideration, particularly in the context of Scotland and DRS is due to be introduced earlier in Scotland (2023) than in the rest of the UK.

#### 'Operator Competence' test for compliance schemes, reprocessors and exporters

We are broadly supportive of the proposal to introduce a technical competence test for compliance schemes. Such a test would allow for any concerns regarding previous compliance history to be considered and provide a basis on which applications could be refused or removed by looking at an operator's management systems, technical and financial competence.
